

Dear parent,

As we move in to the last half term of the academic year, I wanted to bring you up to date with some of the successes of the Trust schools this year.

Both PL and SHSCC hosted Ofsted this year and we were delighted with the positive outcomes for both schools. Both inspection teams praised the accuracy of the schools self-evaluation and recognised the high quality education provided for our students and pupils. What you may not know, is that New Road School also had a visit from Ofsted to pilot the new Inspection Framework. The school volunteered for the visit and again we were delighted with the feedback that the school had. Even though no formal inspection report was written, we feel that the school has made very good progress since the last inspection visit in December 2017 and we are very well prepared for the next scheduled visit some time next academic year.

If you have a child aged 11, 16 and 18 you are very well aware of the SATs, GCSEs and A levels that they have been sitting this summer so far. The SATs went very well and both primary schools are looking for an excellent set of results this summer. As I write, the secondary school exams have just finished and I know how hard both the students and the staff have worked to ensure that they get the results they deserve. Being in school for the exam results in August is always such a pleasure and I look forward to seeing the students with joy on their faces when they open their results envelopes.

As many of you would have seen, the expansion project at New Road is progressing extremely well. The programme is on schedule and the children were delighted to use their new Multi Use Games Area when they came back after half term. We recognise it will be quite tight on the field this term, but we all see the longer term benefits for the school. Many parents have commented on how large the new building looks. It will contain eight classrooms, admin offices, reception, a large hall, offices and break out spaces and new library as well as purpose built pre-school classrooms. The total cost is over £6 million and we are very excited about opening next Easter. Over this summer, work will start on refurbishing the existing school, so parents and children will have much to see when they come back in September.

The Trust has managed to secure funding to replace all the fire doors at Park Lane School and even though we hoped to start this work over the summer holidays, it now seems that this will take place in the autumn with work being carried out after school and into the evenings to minimise disruption to the pupils and to the staff. At the College, work will start in July on the major project replacing the roofs on the sports hall, art rooms and link corridor. We hope to get all this work completed by the end of September.

It is the 50th anniversary of Park Lane Primary and Nursery School this year and to go with the special school photograph taken earlier this year, an evening of music and celebration will take place on the 12th July and we are looking forward to celebrating the last fifty years and are very excited about the next fifty. We feel that the school has an fantastic future ahead.

Park Lane and Sir Harry Smith Local Governing Bodies have both welcomed new governors to their number this year and we also have a new Trustee who has joined the board, who travels over an hour and half just to be with us. We are still looking for dedicated local people who feel that they have something to offer the students and the staff at the schools, so if you are interested in
